The Prior of Clarks well (which was, you know "capitale manerium totius Prioratus Anglie" of the Order of St John of Jer^m.), at the end of his accounts ^{for 1338}, among expenditure, adds

ita terrarum et tenementorum totius regni anglie placitantur et terminantur, continue existentem in eadem curia, pro placitis Prioratus Anglie motis, vel morendis, prosequendis et defendendis.

qualibet nocte, et ferruram cum clavis
pro ij equis dicas, et ij sarcines in aula,
